ENJOY A WEEKEND WITH YOUR DOG

About Us International Canine Events (ICE) staff has been involved in dogs and dog shows for more than 30 years. With our experience, we provide a competitive, yet fun atmosphere for canines and owners alike, while

promoting knowledge, sportsmanship, and recognition of exhibitors.

Every dog receives a certificate with a class award and a copy of the written critique. In

addition every dog has a chance to receive Best of Breed recognition and possibly group placement and Best in Show. Group and Best in Show rosettes go to Puppy, Bred-By Puppy by age class, Adult, and Bred-by Adult. Companions and Veterans can receive Best of Breed and advance to Best in Show. Puppy and Adult Rare Breed dogs have a Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show rosettes. Family Group is awarded Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show. Grand Prix Gold Cup features dogs that are in Grand Prix International Champion class and higher. Once each weekend in conjunction with BIS Show 3, a Grand Prix Gold Cup



BIS and Reserve BIS are chosen. Grand Prix BIS Tournament is a fun fast paced single elimination bracket tournament held on Sunday. Winner receives \$ 100 and entry in the Grand Prix Sieger. Grand Prix Sieger will be awarded to the dog chosen from the competition involving all the BIS winners from all four Shows. Winner will be awarded rosette. There is no Reserve for this competition. Youth ages 10 and up may show in regular and non-regular classes. Junior Showmanship is held on Sundays and is open to youth 6 to 18 years old. Showman younger than 6 years may show with assistance from parent or family member.

New Features to the weekend

American Family Dog Events

The primary purpose of American Family Dog events; Conformation, Tricks, and Beginners Treibball is to promote the sport of dog showing for families with non-registered dogs. **The Conformation competition** will have Four divisions: Small dog under 16 inches at the withers, Medium dog 16 inches to 26 inches at the withers, Large dog over 26 inches at the withers, and Veteran for dogs at least 7 years old. In conformation competition, exhibitors will gait and stack dogs according to the judge's instructions. Dogs will be evaluated on overall show condition, temperament, gait and movement, and ability to perform commands such as sit and down and stand on loose lead. Each exhibitor will receive a copy of the evaluation and a placement ribbon. A Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show will be awarded in each division. Exhibitors must be a least 10 years of age and have complete control of the dog.

There will be a separate competition for **Tricks**. This will be done in tournament style. Each dog can do a maximum of three tricks. Best trick will receive scoring. A Best and Reserve will be awarded for tricks. Suggested tricks are: Sit-up, Kiss, Roll Over, Dance, High Five, Catch and Carry, Leap Through Hoop, Commando, Serpentine or Weave Walk, and On Trust.

The third competition is **Beginners Treibball**. In this urban herding game the dog must push an exercise ball with nose or shoulders from one set of cones approximately 35 feet through to another set. Top four best times are awarded. Owner/exhibitor may use a twenty foot leash because of beginner's status but time penalties will be added for assisting outside of the goal. An All-American Family Dog Certificate of Achievement will be awarded to dogs that enter all three competitions and are well rated.

All dogs must have a current health certificate. Fax/email copy of health certificate at 855-399-0019 or <u>icedogshows@gmail.com</u> Fifteen dollar entry fee per event or forty dollars if entering all three. Enter on-line at <u>www.icedogshows.com</u> in menu bar under Enter a Show and look for AFD button. Closing date to enter American Family Dog Events is 16 April 2014.
